MILLOM MANORIAL COURT RECORDS

The Manorial Records of Millom Manor are held at Carlisle Archives, under Lord Lonsdale's estate.

There are thousands of records relating to the Millom Seigniorship which included the Manors of Millom, Kirksanton, Bootle and Ulpha.n.b. Satterton was in Whicham.

With permission from the Trustees of the Lowther Estate, Millom and District Local History Society have produced these extracts from the Manorial Court Records. They are from a limited period – for other periods please search the Manorial Documents Register at the National Archive or Cumbria Archives (CASCAT).

In the early 18th Century transcripts were made of early court records, the following are photographs from DLONS/W/8/13/31 for the period 1540-1552 but our extracts begin in 1547 with the reign of King Edward 6 (1547-1553).

Therefore he is amerced £o 6^s 8.

☞ And they say that Miles Lesther^t contrary to the command, on the penalty of 40 Shillings, laid upon him by Rich^d Fatus that he the said Miles should remove a Wall at the side of the Banks hath not removed the said Wall. Therefore he the said Miles hath forfeited the said Penalty.

And they say that In^o Ascome of Sacray hath and ought to have one way, called a Way-of-case from his Close called Whynnbank over the Common of pasture as need shall require. &c.

☞ And it is ordered that none shall chide in the any Church or Vicar^{ie} thereof within the Jurisdiction of his Court, neither in the Court, nor shall falsifie before the Lord's Officers there, nor shall falsify the Lords Receiver nor the Steward of his Courts Under the Penalty of 20 Shillings.

Under the Penalty of 10. 6. 8. [But concerning Embracery and Maintenance see the Acts of Parliam^t, which inflict a greater Penalty.]

☞ Also that every Man be at his parish Church on Holy days.

And that no Man kill any other Man's goods, above y^e price of 12^d under the Penalty of 20^s. and ~~of~~ under the price of 12^d under y^e Penalty of 3. 4.

Also they present ^A William Troughton of Stedbank for scandalizing Clement Park, in saying that he the said Clement had Henry Ascome's gold. Therefore he shall forfeit 10. 6. 8. If he proves not those Words at the next Capital Court.

☞ And they say that Willm Myre of Whitehall and his Sons laid in Wait upon the High-way at Mellom to beat John Feese. And George Ascome commended the said Willm and his Sons to keep the Peace under the Penalty of 20 Shillings. But the said Willm and his Sons did not weighing y^e said Penalty, gave Strokes to the said John. Therefore they are amerced 20 Shillings.

And they p^rsent John Stanley for burning diverse Oak Shires, and for diverse Trespasses in the Woods and other Trespasses, contrary to Penalty. Therefore amerced 20 Shillings.

And it is found by the Jurors aforesaid that one Anthony Savage hath called diverse of the Lord's Tenants Main sworn; and is not of good carriage amongst the Tenants there. Therefore it is ordered that he shall for ever future be of ~~carriage~~ good carriage Under the Penalty of being removed out of the Lord's shipp.

Also they find that one place called the Whynns, one place called the Pasture-mouth, one Pasture called the Hill, and another pasture called Styall are the Inheritances of St John Hudleston Knight, and common of pasture to every man's Tenant having common upon the Marsh And therefore they ordaine that no man from henceforth shall turn any Mans goods coming into the same pasture out thereof ~~and thereof~~ Upon Pain to forfeit 20 Shillings. And it shall be lawfull for every Man to putt his goods into every of the said Pastures, when need shall happon by reason of any Water.
