## MILLOM MANORIAL COURT RECORDS

The Manorial Records of Millom Manor are held at Carlisle Archives, under Lord Lonsdale's estate.

There are thousands of records relating to the Millom Seigniorship which included the Manors of Millom, Kirksanton, Bootle and Ulpha. n.b. Satterton was in Whicham.

With permission from the Trustees of the Lowther Estate, Millom and District Local History Society have produced these extracts from the Manorial Court Records. They are from a limited period – for other periods please search the Manorial Documents Register at the National Archive or Cumbria Archives (CASCAT).

In the early 18<sup>th</sup> Century transcripts were made of early court records, the following are photographs from DLONS/W/8/13/31 for the period 1540-1552 but our extracts begin in 1547 with the reign of King Edward 6 (1547-1553).
