MILLOM MANORIAL COURT RECORDS

The Manorial Records of Millom Manor are held at Carlisle Archives, under Lord Lonsdale's estate.

There are thousands of records relating to the Millom Seigniorship which included the Manors of Millom, Kirksanton, Bootle and Ulpha.n.b. Satterton was in Whicham.

With permission from the Trustees of the Lowther Estate, Millom and District Local History Society have produced these extracts from the Manorial Court Records. They are from a limited period – for other periods please search the Manorial Documents Register at the National Archive or Cumbria Archives (CASCAT).

In the early 18th Century transcripts were made of early court records, the following are photographs from DLONS/W/8/13/31 for the period 1540-1552 but our extracts begin in 1547 with the reign of King Edward 6 (1547-1553).

And it is also ordered by the 5^d Jurors that James
Benson of Bawthorpe do amend a gutter between him and
the Tenants of Backstone bank before Easter. Penalty 12^s.
And that the Relict of W^m Fox shall not
hereforth occupy a parcel of Land of Tho. Levetell's
and other persons unless she agree with and accord wth
them at the same. Penalty 20 shillings.

the Thwaits Mill; therefore punished in the Pillory.

And the 5^d Jurors furthermore Order that every
man at the End of his Lands and Inclosures abutting on
Hollgate, shall sufficiently secure the 5^d Pole, and before
the next Bierley. Penalty on each 12^s.

And that the Tenants of the Hill shall
sufficiently make their Bridges at Whitepark, before
y^e next Bierley. Penalty on each 12^s 6^d.

And that none shall make any pits on y^e
Marsh, unless he immediately fill y^e up againe. Pen: 6^d.

of pasture, and he no Tenant therefore amerced 6^s.

And it is ordered that every Tenant having
Land abutting upon the Way leading from Howorrigg

Mills within the Topp, nor there to help any, unless
requested

unless requested. Penalty on Each £. 50 begging 12th.
 (if he has so much) If not on him that receives or
 relieves him that so begs.
